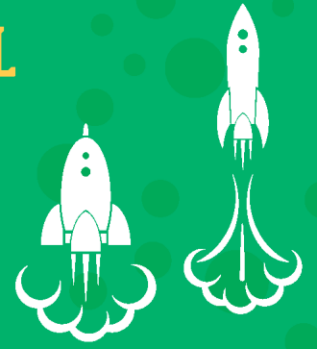
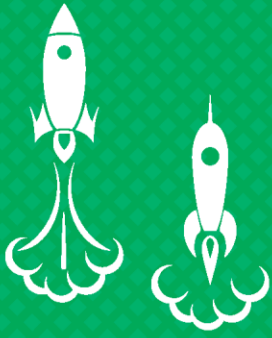

## Computing

In computing, we will be learning how to use spreadsheets. We will be learning how to create spreadsheets to answer mathematical questions, how to create formulas and we will use data to create line graphs.

## RE

## World Book Day
