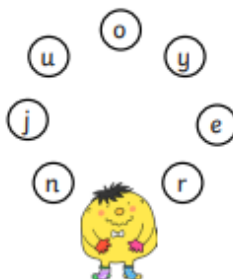
Mr Whoops' Juggling Muddle!

Clumsy Mr Whoops has been juggling with this week's ey words and he's got in a real juggling muddle! Could you help him to unjumble each word, using the clues to help?

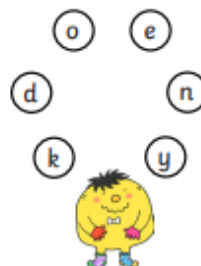
