



Sports Premium Impact Statement 2021-22

At Warwick Road, we firmly believe that physical education is an essential part of a child's educational development. As a school, we seek to provide opportunities to allow pupils to broaden their PE experiences during both curricular and extra-curricular time – providing pathways for pupils who show specific aptitude for individual sports to develop further through the support of local clubs and wider opportunities. Positive participation in physical education will enable children to build self-esteem, teamwork skills and positive attitudes in P.E which we hope will allow them to lead a healthy, active lifestyle and enjoy a lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

For the 2021/22 academic year, the school received a further £18,970 in Sports Premium. With a carry forward of £14880, at total of £33850 Sports Premium was allocated included:

- Update, repair and improve sports and activity facilities on the school grounds
- Refresh PE and playground sports equipment
- Provide additional swimming opportunities lost due to Covid 19
- Increase the number after-school sporting opportunities
- Provide transportation to sporting events
- Access dance workshops
- Maintain schools sports partnership

A breakdown of the implementation and impact of this expenditure is outlined below.
